GUIDELINES FOR LISTENERS

Your Three Primary Responsibilities

1. Support all aspects of the CIA program.

2. Lead your small group of students in understanding, memorizing, and applying scripture.

3. Build a relationship with each student in your small group and pray with them.

Verse Memory Guidelines

- Students should memorize verses before CIA. Help teach them how to do this.
- You may only help each student one time per verse. Three words in a row or the reference is a help.
- Students may recite any verse from the current unit but not pervious units once you have moved past a previous unit.
- Bonus verses must be recited in order. NO SKIPPING IS ALLOWED.
- When a student recites a verse, mark it off on the Student card.

Small Group Time

- You are responsible for the behavior of your students during Small Group time.
- Spend most of your time talking about the lesson, what the verse means and how to apply it, and praying with each student.
- Pray with them and for them each week. Encourage them to pray.
- Once during the unit, the student may receive a point for each lesson verse he/she looks up in the Bible and explains. You may help them locate verses and show them how to use the Table of Contents.
- Devotions can be done each day at home. If a student reads God's word and records a short written entry to show you, they can earn up to 7 points each week (one per day) and an additional point for doing the live it out.

All staff, whether Joy El Generation staff or volunteers, will avoid situations where there is only one adult and one or more children in a room or area that is not readily visible to other staff.

Use discretion with any physical touch, and no physical punishment is permissible.

Student and Parent contact outside of CIA is encouraged. (phone calls, letters...)

Prayer- the Hub of the Bible Adventure Ministry- Praying Scripture

We have students in our schools who will never hear about the love of Jesus except through CIA. Some of those students will only come for a short amount of time. It is our privilege to lift them up in prayer. We need to show how to pray scripture.

Praying scripture may be new to you. To pray scripture, you read the verse and think about what it says and pray it back to God. Sometimes, you can add specifics as you pray the words back to God.

(Put your student's name in the verses where there is a blank)

Father God, we ask that you would allow _____to be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. (Ephesians 6:10)

Heavenly Father, we pray that you will help ______not be ashamed of the gospel because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes. (Romans 1:16)

Dear God, please refresh _____'s soul. Guide _____ along the right paths for your name sake. (Psalm 23:3)

Try praying other verses for and with your students.

Witness Bracelet- Sharing Jesus with others

Black– dark bead–Sin- Romans 3:23- "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

Red– Blood of Jesus– Romans 5:8- "But God demonstrates His love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us".

White– Purity and Cleansing– I John 1:9- "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sin and purify us from all unrighteousness."

Blue– Faithfulness of God– I Corinthians 1:9- "God, who has called you into fellowship with His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful."

Green– Growth– II Peter 3:18– But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

Yellow-gold– Heaven– Revelation 21: 1a and 21b- "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth... The great street of the city was of pure gold, like transparent glass."

Fun Ways to Teach Memory Verses

Erase a Word

Write the words on a dry-erase board. Erase one word or phrase at a time. Then say the verse, remembering the word or phrase that has been erased. Use this same idea with words that have been written on pieces of construction paper (rough up the back with sandpaper or edge of scissors) and place on a flannel board or on a pocket chart.

Varied Voices

Have the group say the verse using a different voice each time. Examples: baby, elderly, husky, squeaky, high-pitched, rapid, slow and drawn out, soft, loud, whisper...

Add-A-Word or Subtract-A-Word

Repeat verse over and over, either deleting the last word from the end each time, or adding a word each time (beginning with the first word).

Sign It

Use sign language to help the students remember the words as they repeat the verse.

Verse Puzzle

Write the memory verse on poster board and cut into pieces. Let the group put the puzzle together. Make two puzzles and have competition between two groups.

Verse Ping-pong

Have two children facing each other. Taking turns, have each child recite the next word of the verse. As soon as the first child finishes the second child should say the next word in the verse. Go back and forth until the verse is completed. Do this several times.

Double it

Say the verse by saying each word once, then twice, then three times.

Quieting Verse

Say the verse in unison, whispering the last word or phrase until the whole verse is being said in a whisper.

WAYS TO DISCIPLINE IN Christian In Action

DISCIPLINE– Proverbs 3:11-12 "My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline and do not resent his rebuke, because the Lord disciplines those he loves, as a father the son he delights in."

The TRAIN Model

T– **Tell them what you expect**

Go over the rules and expectations regularly and clearly Inform them of specific consequences

R- Reward them when they do, Remind them when they don't

Affirm them with a compliment when they do obey Remind them of the expectations when they don't obey

A– Advise them of the consequences

Tell the consequences of disobeying after reminding them of the expectation

I– Implement the consequences

Enforce the consequence exactly as you advised them

N– No surprises

Do not discipline suddenly in your anger or with a consequence you did not tell them.

How to help a student "Begin a Relationship with Jesus"

Our students come to us from a wide range of backgrounds and understanding of God and His Word and the promise of eternal life. Some students already have a relationship with Jesus and are growing in their Christian walk, while others have never heard the story of Jesus and His salvation plan.

Several of our lessons are designed with a salvation emphasis. You may have the opportunity to share with your students and pray with them as they begin a relationship with Jesus.

Students must recognize that:

• Jesus loves him/her.

(John 3:16– "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.")

• He/she has sinned.

(Romans 3:23- "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,")

• Jesus died for my sins.

(I Peter 3:18- "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit.")

• Jesus offers the free gift of salvation

(Romans 6:23– "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.")

- He/she must confess his/her sins and believe that Jesus rose from the dead. (Romans 10:9-10 "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' an believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.")
- Believe in the Lord Jesus (Acts 16:31- "They replied, 'Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved— you and your household."").

This is a precious opportunity to assist a student in beginning a relationship with Jesus. Take the time to review these verses and be ready to share. Pray with and for the students regularly. The Holy Spirit will guide you as you share.

Maximizing Small Group Time

Questions to generate conversation

- ⇒ What can you share with the student about your life? Tell them stories
 Share what you are learning
 Explain how the truths of the lessons apply to you
 Share your salvation experience and testimony
 Tell the students about a failure in your life
 Ask what they want to know about you.
 (This is great for quiet students)
- $\Rightarrow~$ Tell me about something you are interested in... listen intently and ask questions
- ⇒ What can you praise God for in your life?
- ⇒ What would you change in your life if you could?
- ⇒ Tell me about your friends. What made them your friend? What activities do you enjoy together?
- ⇒ Tell me about your family.
 Who do you talk to the most?
 What family activities do you enjoy together?
 Where would you like to go on vacation with them?
 What frustrates you most about your family?
- ⇒ What do you enjoy that really makes you excited?

- Is God satisfied if we are only following the Ten Commandments?
- What else does God want from us?
- What is holding you back from following God completely?
- Is it wrong to be rich?
- How much ministry could be accomplished if you shared your money and time with God?

NOTES:

Review

- Take time to pray with your students.
- Review the lesson verses from the past three weeks.
- Have the students explain the verses.
- Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego said they would follow God even if He didn't rescue them. Are you that confident in God being able to rescue you?
- Naaman had to wash 7 times in the Jordan. Would you have given up at 5-6 or would you have followed directions completely?
- Are you keeping a journal of how God is helping you? It is important to tell others about the "praiseworthy" deeds of the Lord. What could you write in the journal right now?

Unit 4- Lesson 12

Galatians 4

Who am I and why am I here?

Goal– The student will understand they are a sinner who needs Jesus and then needs to share Jesus.

Galatians 4:7 – So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are His child, God has made you also an heir.

Questions for Clarity

- Would you rather be a slave or a son/daughter?
- Did you know each of us is born into slavery?
- Have you asked Jesus to forgive you of your sins?
- Have you moved from being a slave to becoming a child of God?

Acts 9

What is my worth and value?

Goal- The student will recognize his value to God even if his life is a mess.

Ephesians 2:10 - For we are God's handiwork created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Questions for Clarity

- How much is my life worth to God?
- Does God have a plan for me?
- What price did Jesus pay for my sin?
- Saul recognized the LORD when he was on the road to Damascus. Do you recognize Jesus' voice in your life?
- What purpose does God have for your life?

Matthew 14:22-32

Faith- Why Do I Doubt or Question God?

Goal– The student will recognize the benefit of having other believers walk with you, especially when you doubt.

Matthew 14:31– Immediately Jesus reached out His hand and caught him. "You of little faith," He said, "why did you doubt?"

Questions for Clarity

- Why do you sometimes question God?
- Who do you go to when your faith feels weak?
- Would you have had enough faith to step out of the boat in the middle of a storm?
- What stormy situation are you facing?
- Have you reached out for Jesus' help?

- Take time to pray with your students.
- Review the lesson verses from the past three weeks.
- Have the students explain the verses.
- Can you share a testimony about a time when you had fear but realized God was with you?
- When did you have a need and you saw God meet that need?
- Tell me about a time when you felt like you were the only one following God. That is how Elijah felt.

Christmas– Lesson 10

Matthew 1-2 & Luke 1-2

Goal– The student will recognize the importance of Christmas to Christians and the world.

II Corinthians 9:15 – Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift.

Questions for Clarity

- Why did God choose to send a Savior?
- Why was the birth of Jesus "Good News"?
- Looking at our verse, "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift", what was that gift and why was it so important?
- Who will you share the "Good News" with this Christmas?
