

## CIA Student Verse Sheet and Devo/Live it Out – Year 3

Each verse can be recited two times. One point will be given each time. Live it out and devotionals can be done and submitted for one point for each lesson. Gray areas show the end of each unit.

Unit 1 <b>1</b>	<b>II Timothy 3:16</b> – All scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness.	II Timothy 3:16 tells us the Bible is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training. List 2 examples of each of the 4 areas found in Scripture. Write the verses and bring them to class.
<b>2</b>	<b>John 17:17</b> – Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.	Find a truth from Scripture that will help you in life. Write that verse out, memorize it, and share it with your CIA listener. Tell why you chose that verse. And how it will help you in life.
<b>3</b>	<b>Hebrews 4:12</b> – For the Word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.	Choose a topic. What does the Bible say about this? Example: What does the Bible say about obeying parents? List Bible verses and write what you should do.
Unit 2 <b>4</b>	<b>Romans 1:20</b> - For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities – his eternal power, and divine nature. So, they have no excuse for not knowing God.”	Make a list of 10 things God has created that point to his eternal power and divine nature. Write a prayer thanking God for his goodness.
<b>5</b>	<b>Matthew 28:19</b> - Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.	The Trinity is made up of 3 components. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Find 3 verses in the Bible, one to support each of these parts of the trinity. Write them out and bring them to class.
<b>6</b>	<b>John 14:6</b> – Jesus answered, “I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.”	After memorizing John 14:6, a key verse in the Bible, write a letter to Jesus thanking Him for being the Way, the Truth, and the Life.
Unit 3 <b>7</b>	<b>John 14:26</b> – But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.	Write a summary of a time when you didn’t know what you should do, but you prayed and asked God. Write how God provided the Holy Spirit to help you.
<b>8</b>	<b>Hebrews 11:1</b> – Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.	Write down a list of ten things that require faith. Ask yourself whether you have the faith to believe. Write the Bible verse for today under your list. Pray and ask God to help you
<b>9</b>	<b>Matthew 14:31</b> - Immediately Jesus reached out His hand and caught him. “You of little faith,” He said, “why did you doubt?”	Write down 4 things that are testing your faith and causing doubt in your life. Write a prayer to God. Ask God to strengthen you in those situations. Talk to an adult that can help you find verses to help.
Christmas <b>10</b>	<b>II Corinthians 9:15</b> – Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift.	Make four cards to give out this Christmas. Write the verse on each card and share the “Good News” of Jesus with each person as you hand them the card. Pray before you share.
<b>11</b>	<b>Isaiah 9:6</b> – For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.	Choose one of the people in our lesson who was impacted by Jesus birth. Write a first person account of his/her meeting Jesus and what that was like.

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Unit 4 <b>12</b>	<b>Galatians 4:7</b> – So you are no longer a slave, but God’s child; and since you are His child, God has made you also an heir.	Write two paragraphs describing what life as a slave would be like. Write a paragraph describing your life of sin. What is holding you as a slave? Write a thank you note to Jesus for paying for your sin and allowing you to change your status from slave to heir.
<b>13</b>	<b>Ephesians 2:10</b> - For we are God’s handiwork created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.	Imagine you are Saul walking to Damascus. Write a short story about your adventure and your reaction as God got your attention. Share where God is leading you to serve Him.
<b>14</b>	<b>Mark 10:21</b> – Jesus looked at him and loved him. “One thing you lack,” he said. “Go sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.”	What is holding you back from following God completely? Are you holding too tightly to what God has given you? Pray and ask God to help you get rid of the things that are robbing you of life’s best. Make a list of the offensive items and bring the list to class.
Unit 5 <b>15</b>	<b>Romans 12:13</b> – Share with the Lord’s people who are in need. Practice hospitality.	Find five verses that talk about sharing. Write them out and list what is being shared. Does the sharing in each verse meet a physical or spiritual need?
<b>16</b>	<b>Nehemiah 8:6</b> – Ezra praised the LORD, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded, “Amen! Amen!” Then they bowed down and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground.	Find 5 verses on worship. Write them out. Make a list of ways we can worship God. Take time to worship God this week at church and during your quiet time.
<b>17</b>	<b>I Chronicles 16:8</b> – Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done.	Read the lesson verse. Write a prayer, “Give praise to the LORD”. Your prayer should include at least 10 things you are praising the LORD for.
Unit 6 <b>18</b>	<b>Colossians 4:2</b> - Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful.	There are many verses in the Bible on prayer. Search for additional verses. Copy 5 verses. Write a sentence explaining each verse. Share them with a friend.
<b>19</b>	<b>Romans 12:18</b> – If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone.	Think of someone you have treated badly. Go to them and apologize. Write a paragraph about the experience and how you feel about living at peace.
<b>20</b>	<b>Romans 10:9</b> – If you declare with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.	The Samaritans were people that were not well liked. Make a list of 5 people that you know are not following Jesus. Begin to pray for them. Commit to praying every day and invite them to CIA.
Unit 7 <b>21</b> Easter	<b>John 3:16</b> – For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.	Read Matthew 27-28. Make a list of important events that happened in these chapters. The list should include ways that Jesus suffered to pay for our sin. Write a thank you letter to Jesus thanking Him for paying for your sin.
<b>22</b> Easter Review	<b>Luke 24:6</b> – He is not here; He has risen! Remember how He told you, while He was still with you in Galilee.	All year we have been telling you the Good News of Jesus. His birth, ministry, death, and resurrection. Make a list of 10 truths you learned this year. Circle the one that has made the most impact on your life.
